Thomas Carlyle's history of the French Revolution opens with the death of Louis XV in 1774 and ends with Napoleon suppressing the insurrection of the 13th Vendemiaire. Both in its form and content, the work was intended as a revolt against history writing itself, with Carlyle exploding the eighteenth-century conventions of dignified gentlemanly discourse. Immersing himself in his French sources with unprecedented imaginative and intellectual engagement, he recreates the upheaval in a language that evokes the chaotic atmosphere of the events.

Prize-winning translator Joyce Cricks introduction places the work of the Grimms in the literary and historical context of German Romanticism, and demonstrates how the brothers adapted the tales which were not necessarily from the peasant sources they implied. Includes Wilhelm Grimm's preface to the second edition (1819) in which he described their methods of collecting and admitted their intervention.


