Eclipse published some of the first graphic novels and was one of the first comics publishers to champion creators' rights. In the 2000s, he established the imprint The Library of American Comics of IDW Publishing to publish hardcover collections of comic strips. Mullaney and his work have received seven Eisner Awards.

At the same time, she tried journalism and participated in short and medium-length films as a screenwriter and actress, in particular Les Âmes pixellisés, by Michael Castellanet, with Anny Duperey, Roger Miremont, Bernard Le Coq and Jean-Claude Dreyfus.
