society," and "the first feminist technological Utopia."

Very little is known at all about the author. Mizora, the first novel depicting an allfemale utopia appeared anonymously in the Cincinnati Commercial in the winter of 1880-1881. However, when Murat Halstead, the newspaper's editor and publicist, encouraged the author to immediately publish her novel in book form she declined. The novel was eventually published in book form by G.W.

Dillingham in 1890, with copyright registered to Mary E. Bradley.
